Goals: The purpose of this course is to give you basic tools to write your candidacy exam, subsequent F30/F31 proposal, and more generally to begin honing your scientific writing/presentation skills. After an intro into aims writing, we will use the next 3 sessions to workshop your specific aims page (the core of most grant proposals) in small break-out groups. We then do a mock study section, so you can see the inner workings of the grant review process. We will spend two sessions covering central issues for the research strategy (where you describe what you will do and how you will interpret the results) and briefly touch on figure design.
